What is the study about?

What happens to the results of the research study?

The findings will be published in scientific journals, and also made available on our web site after the completion of the study. Your information will be kept **strictly confidential and anonymous**.

Confidentiality

All the information you provide is for research purposes only, and will be kept strictly confidential. TEDS data are sometimes used in future studies and shared with other researchers, but only anonymously, with all personally identifiable information removed.

It is entirely up to you whether or not to participate. If you choose not to, it will not affect your future participation in TEDS studies. If you do participate, you can withdraw again at any time, without having to give a reason.
