TEDS Study (Phase 2): Information Sheet

We would like to invite you to take part in phase 2 of our current TEDS study. Please read this important information about what the study involves. If anything is unclear, or if you would like more information, please get in touch with the TEDS team using the contact details at the top of this information sheet.

What is the study about?

Our new TEDS study consists of a number of questionnaires arranged into themes such as: 'Relationships', 'Life Experiences', 'Wellbeing' and 'Health'. These themes tap into a phase, sometimes referred to as 'emerging adulthood' – the transition from childhood into adulthood and to independence. We hope that you will find the questionnaires interesting, as well as the personalised feedback which we will provide along the way!

What does the study involve?

You can take part in the study on your phone by downloading our new TEDS app. It can also be completed on a PC/laptop or we can send you a paper version on request. You will be asked to complete several questionnaires on a variety of themes. The whole study will take approximately 30 minutes to complete. There is no need to do the whole study in one session. You can complete it in multiple sessions and each time that you log back in you will be able to continue from where you left off. Some of the questions are quite personal, so for privacy you might prefer to be on your own while completing the questionnaires.

What happens to the results of the research study?

The findings will be published in scientific journals, and also made available on our web site after the completion of the study. Your information will be kept **strictly confidential and anonymous**.

Confidentiality

All the information you provide is for research purposes only, and will be kept strictly confidential. TEDS data are sometimes used in future studies and shared with other researchers, but only anonymously, with all personally identifiable information removed.

It is entirely up to you whether or not to participate. If you choose not to, it will not affect your future participation in TEDS studies. If you do participate, you can withdraw again at any time, without having to give a reason.
